This tract of about 80 (based on GIS calculations) acres is located in Noble County near Caldwell, OH.

The access to this tract is excellent. The primary access is along Carlisle Road, CR 43 which travels along the northern boundary of the tract.

Access within the tract is fair. A few old skid trails were walked during this reconnaissance. There is a slightly traveled ATV trail that travels out the ridge on the western side of the property.

General Woodlands Description

The ephemeral and intermittent watersheds within the tract drain into Schwab Run, a tributary of the Muskingum River. Topography of this tract ranges from narrow flat ridges with steep hillsides leading to gradual benches. Operability is fair.




The northern boundary of the tract follows the county road. Timber changes and field edges were also evident along the rest of the tract. The boundary evidence appeared to stay relatively true to the given boundary shapefile.

Timber Resources

The timber quality within this tract is of fair quality. Most of the tract is made up of pole to small saw timber (6"-12") with some scattered mature trees throughout the property. The tract is primarily a dry southern aspect consisting primarily of mixed oak species. Most of the tract has been thinned within the past 20 years removing larger mature trees from the overstory.

Most of the acreage of the tract is old field reverting to forestland. These areas are made up of pole timber that show great potential for a quality future stand of timber with high species diversity.

This tract of about 211 (based on GIS calculations) acres is located in Noble County near Caldwell, OH.

Access within the tract is great. A gated road provides great access out the ridge to the center of the property. ATV trails travel throughout the rest of the property. A few old skid trails were walked during this reconnaissance.

General Woodlands Description

The ephemeral and intermittent watersheds within the tract drain into Duck Creek, a tributary of the Ohio River. Topography of this tract ranges from flat ridges with moderately steep hillsides leading to the drains. Operability is fair.




The southern boundary of the tract follows the county road. Some of the southeastern boundary had been painted with orange paint. Old fencing was also evident along some of the tract. The boundary evidence appeared to stay relatively true to the given boundary shapefile.

Timber Resources

The timber quality within this tract is of fair quality. Most of the tract is made up of pole to small saw timber that is composed of yellow poplar near the drains converting to mixed oaks, maples, and hickory as you get closer to the ridge tops. Most of the tract has been thinned within the past 20 years. Less than 5 acres of this tract are able to be harvested in the next 5 years, but a large portion of the tract could be ready for harvest in the next 15 years.

Most of the acreage of the tract is old field reverting to forestland. These areas are made up of pole timber that show great potential for a quality future stand of timber with high species diversity.

Location & Access

This tract of about 305 (based on GIS calculations) acres is located in Noble County near Caldwell, OH.

The access to this tract is excellent. The primary access is along Archers Ridge Road, TH 307 which travels along the northeastern edge of the tract. Fulda Road, CR 2, travels along the ridge from the northern side of the tract to the southwestern side.

Access within the tract is great. A gas well road provides great access to the center of the property. A farm road provides access to some meadows and a barn on the western side of the property. ATV trails travel throughout the rest of the property. A few old skid trails were walked during this reconnaissance.

General Woodlands Description

The ephemeral and intermittent watersheds within the tract drain into Schwab Run, a tributary of the Ohio River. Topography of this tract ranges from flat ridges with moderately steep hillsides leading to the drains. Operability is fair.

Property Lines

The northeastern boundary of the tract follows the county road. Some of the southeastern boundary follows a pipeline right of way. Old fencing was also evident along some of the tract. The boundary evidence appeared to stay relatively true to the given boundary shapefile.




The timber quality within this tract is of fair quality. Most of the tract is made up of pole to small saw timber that is composed of yellow poplar near the drains converting to mixed oaks, Hickory, and maples as you get closer to the ridge tops. Most of the tract has been harvested within the past 20 years, primarily removing mature sawtimber trees.

Most of the acreage of the tract is old field reverting to forestland. These areas are made up of pole timber that show great potential for a quality future stand of

This tract of about 132 (based on GIS calculations) acres is located in Noble County near Caldwell, OH.

The access to this tract is excellent. The primary access is along Fulda Road, CR 43 which travels through the tract splitting it into two sections.

Access within the tract is fair. A few old skid trails were walked during this reconnaissance. A gated road enters the southern portion of the tract allowing vehicle access to an open area with an old camper. There is a slightly traveled ATV trail that travels out the ridge from the small opening. The northern portion of the tract also has older skid trails throughout, but no evidence of ATV travel into this area.

General Woodlands Description

The ephemeral and intermittent watersheds within the southern portion of this tract drain into Mare Run, a tributary of the Ohio River. The ephemeral and intermittent watersheds within the northern portion of this tract drain into Schwab Run, also making its way to the Ohio River. Topography of this tract ranges from flat ridges to moderately steep hillsides leading to the drains. Operability is fair.


Old fence was found in a few locations but was very scarce. Timber changes were also evident on the southern portion of the tract. The old fence and timber changes appeared to stay relatively true to the given boundary shapefile.


Timber Resources

The timber quality within this tract is of fair to good quality. The eastern slopes on this tract are composed primarily of yellow poplar in the small to medium saw timber range (12"-20"). The west and southern aspects consist of a dry oak hickory site that converts to poplar near the drain, which is mostly medium size saw timber. Most of the tract has been thinned within the past 25 years.

TRACT 11




Property Lines

Old fence and pink flagging were observed around the boundary in most places. The flagging and fence stayed relatively true to the given boundary shapefile.

Timber Resources

The timber on this tract has been harvested within the past year. A thinning of only large mature sawtimber size trees were cut. Most of the harvesting occurred on the mid to lower slopes of the tract. Leaving a stand of young trees in the pole to small sawtimber size class (6-14"). The next thinning could be conducted in 20 or so years. Yellow poplar, soft maple, and hard maple can be found on the eastern aspect of the tract. Yellow poplar and a mix oak species cover the western aspect of the tract.




Old barbed wire fence was observed in only a couple locations during the field visit. The fence stayed true to the given boundary shapefile.

The timber quality within this tract is of fair quality. The mid and lower slopes of the tract was thinned 10 to 15 years ago resulting in a poorly stocked stand with lots of thick undergrowth. The remaining trees are in the pole to small sawtimber size class with scattered medium size timber of yellow poplar, soft maple, and oak. The next harvest would require 10 to 15 years of growth before a thinning could occur. The upper slopes were heavily cut during the previous harvest resulting in thick undergrowth and sapling size trees. Some of the ridges are non-forested fields and utility right-of-ways.

All of this tract was found to be manageable from a timber standpoint.

Access within the tract is poor. The timber was removed through the adjoining tract #13 in the previous harvest. Only old skid trails and ATV trails exists within the property boundaries.

The ephemeral streams within this tract drain into Buffalo Creek a tributary of the Muskingum River. Topography of this tract ranges from flat broad ridges to mildly steep drains. Operability is excellent.





The remaining trees are in the pole to small sawtimber (6-12") size class with scattered medium size timber (16-20") of yellow poplar, soft maple, and oak. 
Old fence and pink flagging were observed around the boundary in most places. The flagging and fence stayed relatively true to the given boundary shapefile.

Most of the harvesting occurred on the mid to lower slopes of the tract. Leaving a stand of young trees in the pole to small sawtimber size class (6-14"). The next thinning could be conducted in 20 or so years. The upper slopes comprised of old overgrown farm fields with thick undergrowth and sapling size trees.




Only one old fence was observed during the field visit on the eastern side of the tract. The fence stayed true to the given boundary shapefile. No other property lines were found.
